

4. ARE YOU A MEMBER? Every officer of the Regular Army, the National Guard, and the Organized Reserves should be a member of this Association, which is national in scope. The Association was organized in San Francisco on Armistice Day, 1921, by officers of the National Guard and the Organized Reserves, and was inspired by a desire on the part of those officers to insure that the costly lessons of the World War should be turned to profit.
