1. This card is to be delivered to the officer named for retention as his personal record and as evidence of his National Guard status as recorded in the Militia Bureau.
2. A Federally recognized National Guard officer has, in addition to his State status, a Federal status, which may not be changed or terminated without the authority of the Militia Bureau, given either through regulations or instructions published for the guidance of all, or by special authority in each case.
3. The commissions of officers of the National Guard are vacated (1) by death; (2) when they reach the age of 64 years; (3) by discharge for physical disability on recommendation of a board of medical officers; (4) upon receipt by them of notification of acceptance by proper authority of resignation; (5) by discharge upon recommendation of an efficiency board; (6) when dropped from the rolls for an absence without leave for more than three months; (7) by dismissal pursuant to sentence of a general court-martial.
4. Transfers in same grade and arm will be covered by the issuance of Form 3-b M. B. Officers do not lose their recognition status by such transfers.
5. Officers may be transferred to the unassigned list upon the submission of their resignations and pending acceptance of same. Form 3-c M. B. will issue in case of separation from the active National Guard.
