turned: 1. With information that Pvt Roy V Phillips, who was a member
of troop C, 1st Colorado Cavalry, while on duty with 1st Provisional
Regt of Cavalry at Brownsville Texas, was granted on or about the
1st day of March 1917 a furlough for 30 days to stand trial in
Federal court in state of Kansas.

2. On or about March 15 1917, the 1st Colorado Cav, was ordered
to Wyoming and was mustered out of Federal service, on or about March
25/17. On verbal orders of the C.O. 1st Provisional Cav, Lt Col James
J Hartman. All final statements accounts, and all records pertaining
to men who were absent from command were turned in to Hq 1st Provi-
sional Cav, at Brownsville Texas.

3. Pvt Roy V Phillips, was notified by troop commander to apply
to nearest mustering Officer for muster out, giving information to this
Officer that all papers pertaining to his status had been turned
over to the C.O. 1st Provisional Regt of Cavalry.

4. During the month of April 1917, Pvt Roy V Phillips, applied
to and obtained from the Governor of the state of Colorado, a disch-
arge from the Military service, on account of Dependents, records of
which are on file in Adjutant General's office, Capitol Building
Denver Col.

5. No Official documents of troop C 1st Col Cav, are avail-
able at this time in the A.E.F.
